



## Protecting Lives, Saving Futures March 5-7, 2014

Protecting Lives, Saving Futures is a course designed to teach law enforcement officers and prosecutors the basics of standardized field sobriety testing, report writing, and courtroom preparation and testimony in impaired driving cases. This multi-disciplinary curriculum allows prosecutors and officers the opportunity to learn firsthand the challenges and difficulties each faces in impaired driving cases. It focuses on teamwork and collaboration in the investigation and prosecution of DWI offenses.

This is a basic-level course designed for attendees with limited experience in the detection, apprehension, and prosecution of impaired drivers. Law enforcement officers attending this course should have completed basic SFST training.

Space in this course is limited. For that reason, applications must be submitted. Although not required, preference will be given to applications submitted jointly by a prosecutor and law enforcement officer from the same jurisdiction.

**Applications will not be accepted from anyone who has previously attended this class.** *Because this is a basic-level course, it is not generally appropriate for officers who are SFST Instructors or Drug Recognition Experts.* This class will qualify for both CLE and POST credit.

There is no registration fee for this course. Lodging will be provided. Breakfast will be provided March 5, 6 and 7; and lunch will be provided on March 5 and 6. Participating jurisdictions will need to cover the cost of travel to and from Columbia, evening meals, and any other related expenses.
